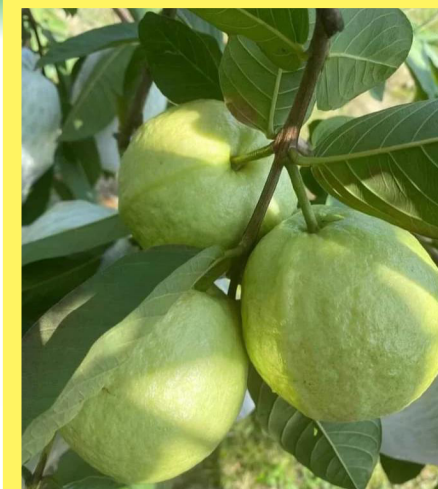

# From Seed to Prosperity: ‘

Mbegu na Karinda’ Programme Delivers Hope and High Yields Across Embu



EVIDENCE OF SEEDS PROGRAMME TO PROSPERITY

Embu: The green fields stretching across Embu County tell a compelling story of a strategic investment that is bearing fruit. During the April–June 2026 quarter, Embu County Government, under the leadership of Governor Cecily Mbarire and through the Department of Agriculture, continued implementing one of its flagship agricultural interventions—the distribution of certified seeds to farmers across the county.

The programme, which

targeted maize, beans and other essential crops, was designed to improve productivity, enhance food security and boost household incomes by ensuring farmers access quality planting materials at the onset of the long rains season.

Today, evidence of the programme’s success is visible in every corner of the county. From Mbeere North and Mbeere South to Runyenjes, Manyatta and Mwea, farmers have shared encour-

aging reports and photographs on social media showcasing healthy crops, uniform germination and vigorous growth. The lush green maize fields and thriving bean crops have become a source of optimism for farming families and a testament to the effectiveness of the county’s agricultural support initiatives.

Agricultural experts note that certified seeds play a critical role in improving crop performance because they are tested for

# FROM FARM TO DESK

## SCHOOL MEALS PROGRAMME LIFTS EMBU

The joint visit comes as the programme records strong gains in both child nutrition and local economic growth. By sourcing food directly from farmer coopera-

tives within the county, schools are serving pupils fresh, diverse meals while guaranteeing a steady market for local producers.

County officials noted,

“Children are healthier, more attentive in class, and attendance has improved. At the same time, our farmers have a predictable income, which strengthens household resilience and the wider rural economy.”

The Home-Grown model links agriculture directly to education outcomes, reducing reliance on external food aid and building self-sustaining food systems. Cooperatives report increased production and better

Runyenyes, specifically along the stretch from Njiru Giconge to Ndoka Street. A primary objective of this transition is to address recurring challenges with infrastructure security. To prevent the theft of lighting components that has affected previous projects, the county is implementing strict mechanical security measures. All new solar units are being permanently welded to their supports to deter unauthorized removal. Both mechanical and electrical engineers are on-site to oversee the structural integrity of every installation, ensuring they are tamper-resistant and durable.

By moving away from the national electricity grid and adopting solar energy, the County Government aims to significantly lower monthly utility expenditures. This move provides a sustainable solution that ensures the lights remain functional even during power outages, offering consistent service to residents. The new solar units come with a comprehensive warranty of three, representing a long-term investment in the county's infrastructure. Officials noted during the inspection that this initiative is a direct response to the need for better service delivery through sustainable and cost-effective energy solutions. According to the engineer, once the batteries are fully charged, the lights are capable of operating continuously for approximately 15 to 18 hours, ensuring reliable lighting throughout the night. He also noted that the lights are fitted with sensors that automatically switch on when darkness falls and switch off during the day.

This project marks a significant advancement in the county's commitment to modernizing local infrastructure and ensuring the safety and well-being of Embu residents through innovative technology.

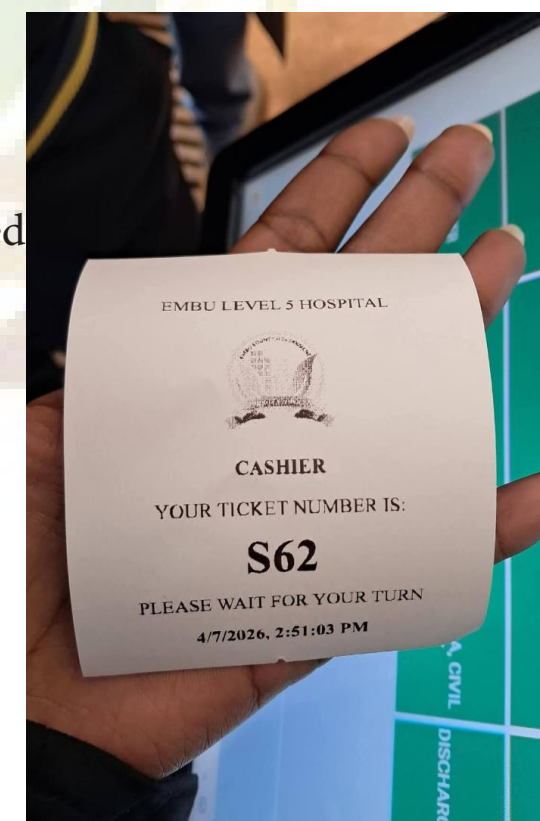

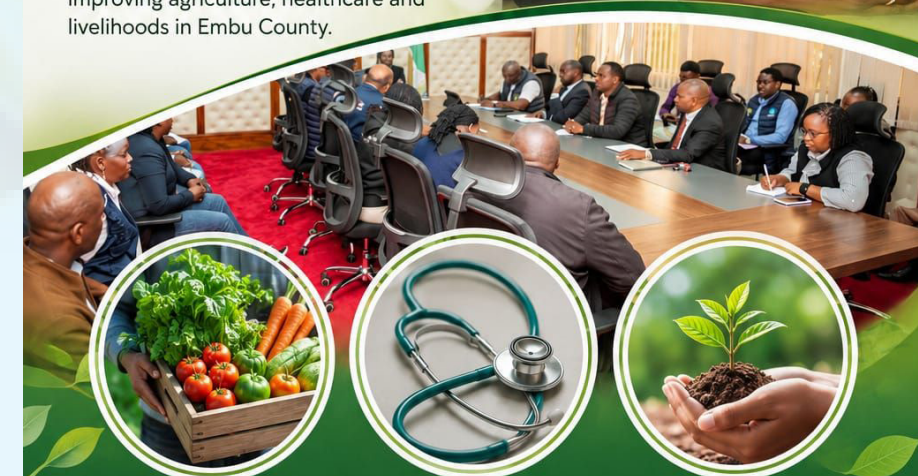

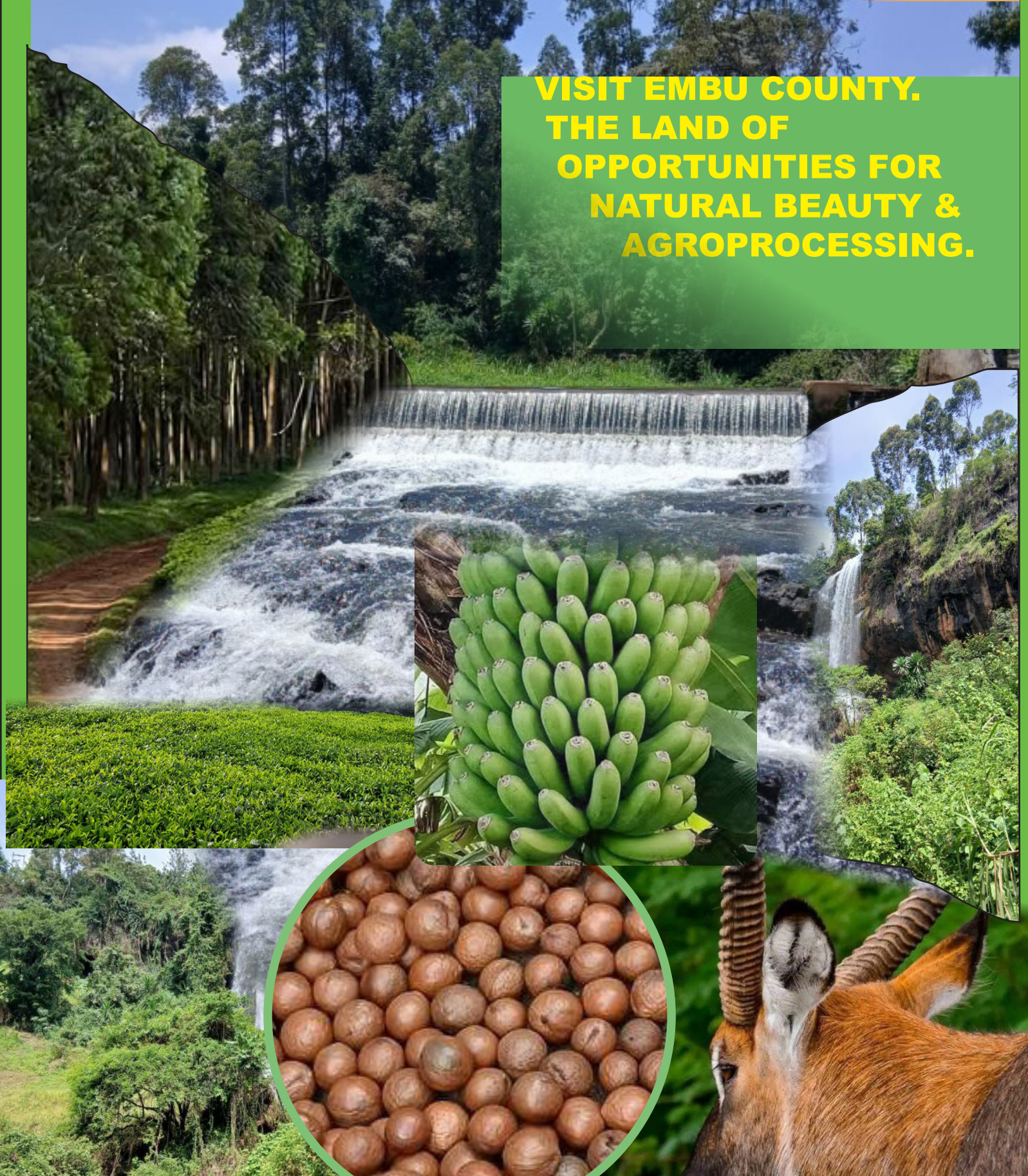
